

ORDINANCE 14

STUDENTS

1. Students of the University are persons registered as pursuing in a Member Institution or a Central Academic Body¹ the whole or part of a course of study leading to an award of the University or a Member Institution. These may include persons registered by a Member Institution who are following the whole or part of a course of study leading to an award under distance learning arrangements controlled by that Member Institution, provided that such arrangements will enable the persons concerned to participate in, as appropriate, Member Institution governance.
2. For the avoidance of doubt, Sabbatical Officers of Students' Unions at Member Institutions shall be regarded as Students of the University.

ASSOCIATE STUDENTS

3. The status of Associate Student shall be accorded to persons, not being Students as defined under paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, who are registered by the University or a Member Institution for a course of study undertaken under distance learning arrangements.

The status of Affiliate Student shall be accorded to persons who are registered for the BA in Acting at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art under a validation arrangement with King's College London.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

5. Each Member Institution shall maintain the register of the persons registered at its institution with the status of Student and, if applicable, of Associate Student, and shall make available that register to the Vice-Chancellor. The same provisions shall apply to King's College London in respect of the Affiliate Students registered at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art.
6. Registers of Students registered with the University shall be maintained under the direction of the Vice-Chancellor.
7. The University of London shall provide an Alumni Society for Graduates who have obtained their degrees through University of London Worldwide and other Students with no Member Institution affiliation.
