Research Ethics Committee Mode of Operation

Further details of the Research Ethics

mode of operation are as follows:

- (I) Frequency of meetings: The Research Ethics Committee meets at least twice per year, reconvening if necessary.
- (II) Ethical Reviews: Ethical assessments are reviewed by correspondence by a group of expert reviewers (to be determined by the Ethics Committee). Any assessments which have been graded at C will automatically require particular attention from members of the Committee, which is to be given within five working-days.
- (III) Representatives from the School of Advanced Study (SAS), the Senate House Library (SHL), University of London Worldwide (Worldwide) and the University of London Institute in Paris (ULIP), and the Head of Health and Safety, University of London will be consulted as appropriate, and views fed into the Ethics Committee.
- (I) approval, having sought the advice of at least one other member of the Committee.
